FINE ART CONSIGNMENT AGREEMENT

THIS CONSIGNMENT AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 21st day of June 2009 between the artist, as printed under artist name to the right, and the Lake Oswego Festival of the Arts, hereinafter called "Dealer."

Artist has delivered or is about to deliver to Dealer a work of fine art created by Artist, which Dealer hereby accepts or agrees to accept on consignment for sale on a commission basis. The terms and conditions of this consignment agreement are as listed below.

NO copies of other artist's work in any medium. The submitted piece must be original in concept, design and execution. NO mechanical copies (laser, giclee, etc.) will be accepted. All work must be for sale.

1. Artist offers this work of art for sale at the above listed price in the box marked "Price."
2. Registration Fee for UNJURIED SHOW is \$25.00 (for each three pieces per medium).
3. The said work of fine art may be sold for cash. If the said work of fine art is sold for cash, Dealer is to retain 40% and shall remit all of the remainder of the sale price to Artist within thirty (30) days from date of sale.
4. **Work will not be hung if not properly framed with PICTURE HANGING WIRE and/or properly secured with glass or plexi-glass. NO unframes, zigger type, rings, garden wire or strings!**
5. If the said work of fine art is not sold, Artist agrees to remove it June 28th between the hours of 6:30 PM and 7:30 PM and Dealer shall not be held liable for the loss of, or damage to the work of fine art if Artist fails to remove the work within a period of (30) days following the said date agreed upon for the removal of the work. It is understood that a rental fee per day will be imposed after such date. Dealer's right to sell the work of fine art shall continue, however, until the work is actually removed.

YOU MUST HAVE YOUR CLAIM CHECK!

6. Pick up work on Sunday, June 28, 2009 between the hours of 6:30 PM to 7:30 PM.

The word "Artist" as used herein, means the creator of a work of original fine art, or if the Artist is deceased, the Artist's personal representative, heir, or legatee's. The word "Dealer" as used herein, means an individual, partnership, firm, association or corporation, other than a public auctioneer, that undertakes to sell a work of fine art created by another. As used herein, the singular shall include the plural and all grammatical changes shall be deemed to be made and implied.

The Lake Oswego Festival of the Arts is announcing its "Call to Artists" for 2009 exhibits at Lakewood Center for the Arts and George Rogers Park in Lake Oswego, Oregon. The dates for this year's festival will be **June 26, 27, & 28, 2009**.

The Lake Oswego Festival of the Arts, now in its 46th year, is a program division of Lakewood Center for the Arts, a non-profit organization. The Arts Festival has grown to include an open art show of more than 1,100 artists, a Craft Faire featuring more than 110 Northwest artists, interactive artist demonstrations and a juried exhibit of Northwest artists. Now attracting 22-25,000 people, this three-day celebration also showcases a performing art series, music in the park, special art exhibits, and a children's art and performance venue at Lakewood Center for the Arts and at George Rogers Park.

In 2009 the Festival will feature an exhibit entitled, **Cutting Edges: Contemporary Mosaic Art**. This exhibit will be the largest mosaic fine art exhibit ever offered in the United States. Modern mosaic art encompasses a vast range of exciting techniques, materials and styles. The world-renowned artists chosen for this show have transformed this ancient art with contemporary designs while embracing traditional methods. Invited artists will display works incorporating stone, metal, precious jewels, glass, recycled and found items with vibrant results. Lectures, displays, and demonstrations featuring the techniques of this art form are also scheduled throughout the three-day Festival.

The Open Show exhibit is one of the largest exhibits of its kind on the west coast. Registration is one day only on Sunday, June 21, 2009 from 1:00 - 4:00 PM. An entry form is available ahead of time on Lakewood's website at www.lakewood-center.org. The registration fee is \$25 for three (3) entries per medium. This exhibit is open to all Northwest artists. If you are unable to attend that day, you may designate a representative to bring your submitted pieces and registration forms.

Event Profile: The Festival of the Arts, celebrating its 46th year, is a major regional non-profit arts event, presenting the creative endeavors of recognized and emerging artists from all facets of the art world. The Festival enjoys an outstanding reputation for bringing special exhibits of quality and diversity to the weekend that are accessible to everyone. Documented numbers show that the Festival attracts 25,000 visitors during the three days of the event. The Festival provides three major exhibition opportunities for artists during the event: The Open Show (an unjuried exhibit open to Northwest artists), The Artist's Vision (a juried exhibit open to Northwest artists) and the Craft Faire (open to artisans and exhibitors of fine craft work throughout the U.S.).

Participation Criteria for the Unjuried Open Show:

- Registration at Lakewood Center, 368 S. State Street, Lake Oswego, OR 97034
Sunday, June 21, 2009, 1 to 4 PM (One day only).
An entry form/contract will be available to download in advance at: www.lakewood-center.org starting May 1, 2009. It will be the artist's responsibility to bring **3 copies** of each form for each piece submitted on registration day. Hard copy forms will also be available on site the day of registration.
- Registration fee \$25.00 for three (3) entries per medium. Open to all Northwest artists.
- All work must be for sale.
- A 40% commission will be taken on all sales.
- Only original artwork created within the last two (2) years and not previously entered at this art show, will be accepted. Please note: NO mechanical prints or giclees accepted. Also, NO copies of other artists' works.
- All entries must be dry, framed, matted and mounted, hung with PICTURE HANGING WIRE. All glass must be properly secured. (No Uniframes, zigger type or rings, garden wire or string). Your framing will be checked at registration.
- Hanging will be arranged at the discretion of the curator.
- All work must hang for the duration of the Festival until **6:30 PM, June 28, 2009**
- Artists must supply security cases for small objects.
- All art must be picked up **Sunday, June 28, 2009**, between the hours of **6:30 PM - 7:30 PM.**
- No work will be released without artist's claim check.

FESTIVAL AND COMMUNITY PROFILE

The Festival of the Arts, celebrating its 46th year in 2009, is a major regional arts event, presenting the creative endeavors of recognized and emerging artists from all disciplines of the art world. The Festival enjoys an outstanding reputation for bringing special exhibits of quality and diversity to the weekend that are accessible to everyone. It is traditionally held at the end of June of each year and attracts 22-25,000 people.

Each year a different type of art is featured in the Special Exhibit which is meant to engage and educate the public. In 2009 the Festival will feature an exhibit entitled, **Cutting Edges: Contemporary Mosaic Art**. This exhibit will be the largest mosaic fine art exhibit ever offered in the United States. Modern mosaic art encompasses a vast range of exciting techniques, materials and styles. The world-renowned artists chosen for this show have transformed this ancient art with contemporary designs while embracing traditional methods. Invited artists will display works incorporating stone, metal, precious jewels, glass, recycled and found items with vibrant results. Lectures, displays, and demonstrations featuring the techniques of this art form are also scheduled throughout the three-day Festival.

Community of Lake Oswego:

Located 8 miles south of Portland, Lake Oswego is a well educated and arts conscious community. The Festival of the Arts has been a popular event staged by the Lakewood Center and draws approximately 25,000 visitors over a three day weekend.

A COMMUNITY EVENT - EDUCATION, ART EXHIBITS, DEMONSTRATIONS:

This is a complete community event with a high profile that is a reflection of the quality of living and working in Lake Oswego. The ARTS are integrated into events to create community and build connections across generations. The Festival nurtures this concept by creating a venue for experiencing the arts by seeing, touching, listening, participating, and learning.

The Festival of the Arts takes place at the Lakewood Center for the Arts and George Rogers Park, both on State Street in downtown Lake Oswego, Oregon USA.

- In the park, you will find a juried Craft Faire of 110 booths featuring fine arts crafts, a delightful variety of foods at the Food Court, and a variety of musical entertainment on the Park Entertainment Stage. The park also features Family Day Activities, and ongoing demonstrations by the artisans.

- At the Lakewood Center for the Arts, several different art exhibits are featured. The largest exhibit is the Visual Arts Open Show with over 1,100 pieces of art submitted by artists from all over the region. In addition, the Festival also presents a Special Juried Exhibit of fine artwork as well as a series of hands-on arts activities. The Festival also partners with the Lake Oswego School District to present a high quality K-12 exhibit and the Lake Oswego Foundation for the Arts to provide the Lake Oswego Arts Chronicle, a juried visual art exhibit.

PARTNERSHIPS:

The Festival was originally started by the Lake Oswego Chamber of Commerce and moved under the umbrella of the Lakewood Center for the Arts 20 years ago, as an annual activity of the Center. It is sustained by valuable partnerships with the City of Lake Oswego, Clackamas County Tourism and Development Council, the Chamber of Commerce, the School District, small and large businesses, the "Friends of the Festival," plus more than 450 volunteers who work throughout the year and the weekend to make the Festival the success it is.

The Festival, a sub division of Lakewood Theatre Company/Lakewood Center for the Arts, a 501 (c)(3) non-profit arts organization, is committed to arts education, performance and exhibition.
